### YEAR ROUND UP

As we are inching ever nearer to the end of the school year, now is a good opportunity to reflect on the past year at Kineton Playgroup. Children have had several exciting visits this year; to St Francis Catholic Church, to St Peter's Church as well as two trips to Compton Verney, all of which generated much excitement and were a great success! We were thrilled to be able to run a nativity play in the school hall again in December; thank you to everyone at Kineton Primary School for hosting us. This is the only time in the year when the whole Playgroup community comes together, and this year's performance was truly joyful.

Open days at Playgroup have been well attended this year, as have been our Easter Egg Hunt and Church services for Harvest, Christmas and Easter; it is always so lovely to welcome parents to join us for these events. We have also had lots of visits from a range of mystery readers this year; the children love seeing who is coming to read them a story so thank you to all the mummies, daddies and grandparents who have been able to join us.

We have recently held two Sport's Days which were enjoyed by everyone; I even heard parents chatting about it at the School Sport's Day, particularly commenting on the lovely cuddles the children got at the end of their races!

Events such as these take an incredible amount of planning, so a big thank you to all of the Playgroup staff for their excellent organisation, and to all of you parents who come along and offer support.

### **FEE INCREASE**

From September 2025, there will be an increase of 6% to Kineton Playgroup and KASC fees. This is to cover rises to the National Living Wage as well as the increase in National Insurance contributions employers are required to make. To put this into the context of two real examples; a full day at Playgroup for a 3 year old will increase from £41.86 to £44.37 and a KASC session until 5pm for a school-aged child will increase from £14.02 to £14.86. Remember, prompt payment merits a 10% discount!

If you have not already done so, do check whether you are eligible to pay for Playgroup or KASC sessions through the government's tax-free childcare scheme: www.childcarechoices.gov.uk


Along with raising my two children, I work five days a week at Kineton High School.
